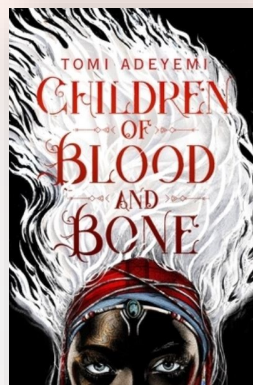
An illustrated guide to Black British history, from the Romans to Windrush to modern day.



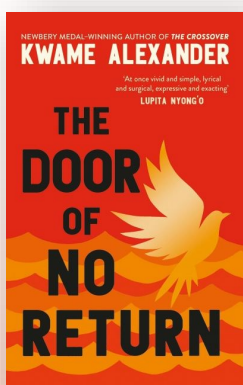

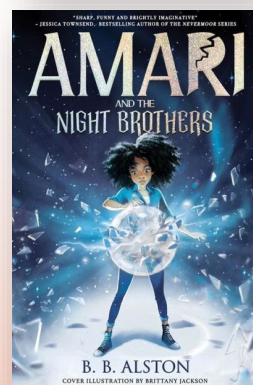
A colour-illustrated collection of stories and poems celebrating joy, showcasing 40 talented Black writers and artists from across the world.



A teenage girl strives to bring back magic to her people and overthrow the King that had all the maji killed, including her mother.



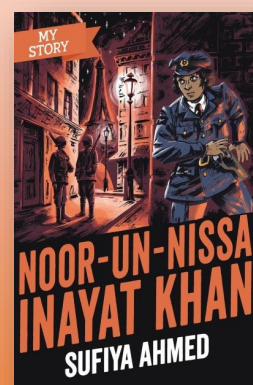
First in an epic trilogy of verse novels set in 19th century Ghana, following a boy who is sold into slavery.



Amari Peters knows three things. Her big brother Quinton has gone missing. No one will talk about it. His mysterious job holds the secret ...



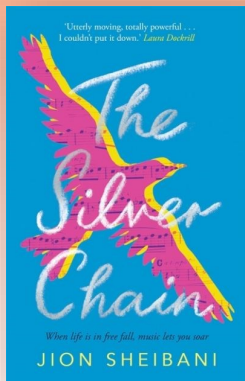
Two school friends find their blogs go viral when they start posting articles and videos online heralding women's rights.



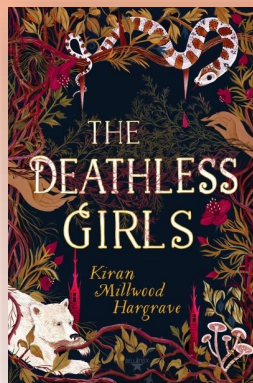
During World War 2, a young woman flees the Nazis in France, becomes an agent for the British and is sent back undercover to France to spy for the SOE. Based on a true story.

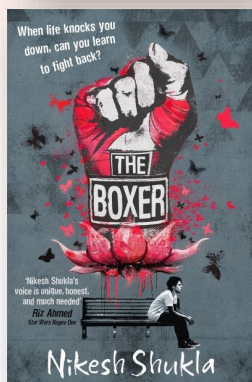

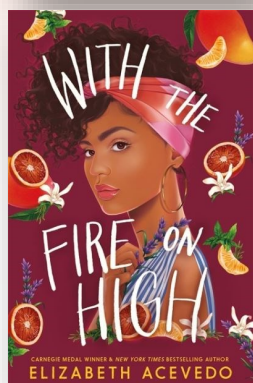
An illustrated coming-of-age verse novel about family, mental health and the healing power of music.



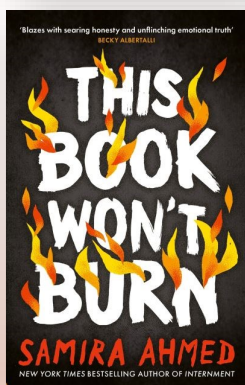
A reimagining of the Dracula legend from the point of view of the women taken to be his brides.



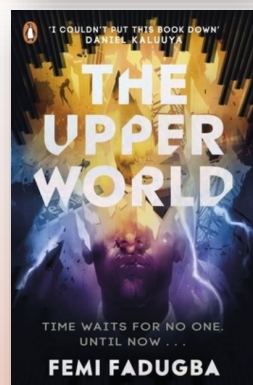
A teenage boy takes up boxing after being the victim of an unprovoked racist attack.



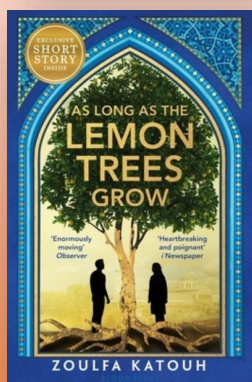
A teenage mother hopes to realise her dream of becoming a successful chef.

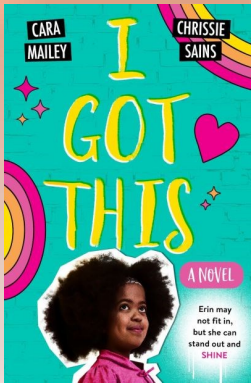


When her mother is kidnapped, seventeen-year-old master thief, Roslyn Quest, has to win the thieves gambit to save her.

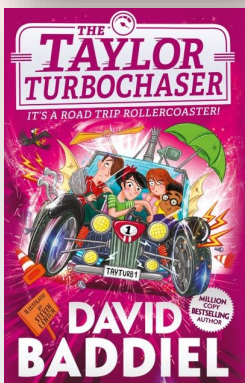

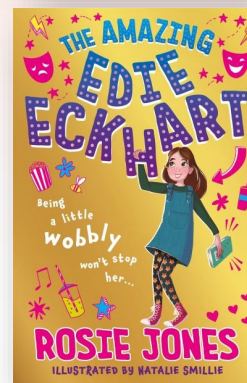
A young girl with achondroplasia seeks to break through barriers by appearing in her favourite band's music video.



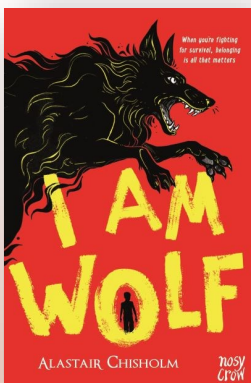
A girl who suffers from anxiety attacks after the death of her baby sister meets a disabled boy in an art therapy class and their growing relationship helps her deal with her grief.



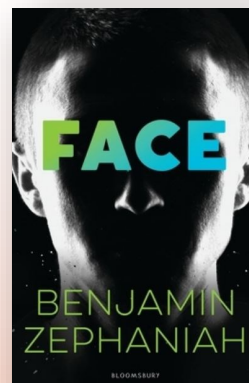
A girl has a fantastic adventure when her best friend pimp her wheelchair to be a supercar.



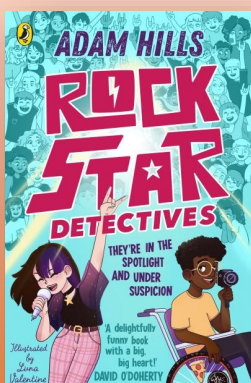
A girl with cerebral palsy deals with starting secondary school and starring in the school play.

A young man's life is completely changed when his face is badly scarred following a car accident.



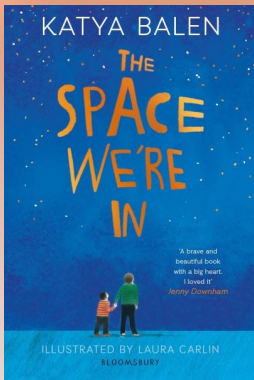
Two children have to prove they are innocent when they are suspected of stealing a priceless painting.



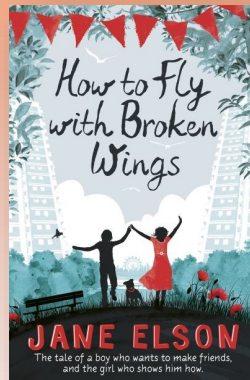
Follows a teenager with a rare growth disorder as he struggles with his studies and changes to his friendship group.

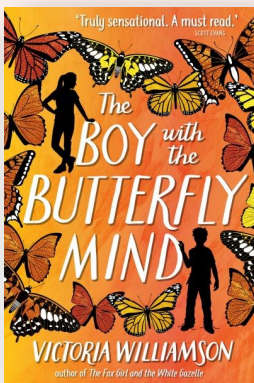

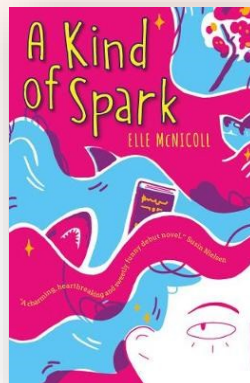
A young boy struggles to help his autistic brother when their mother becomes ill.



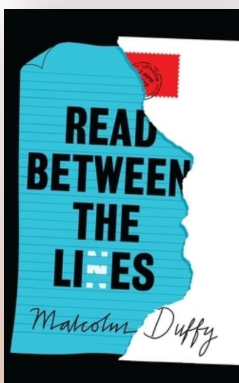
A girl befriends a boy with Aspergers Syndrome and vows to tackle the gang bullying him, as well as realise their shared dream of being able to fly.



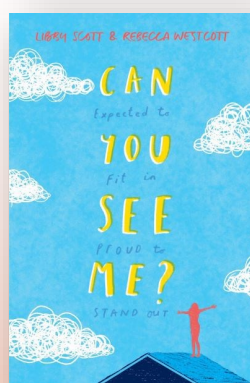
Two very different teenagers, one with ADHD, the other with the need to be perfect, learn to appreciate each other when their families blend.



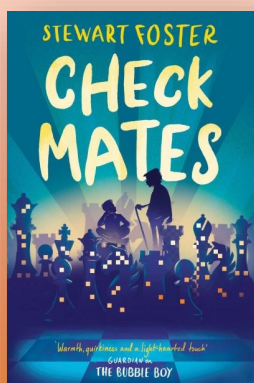
A young girl campaigns for historic wrongs to be righted, whilst also dealing with her autism.



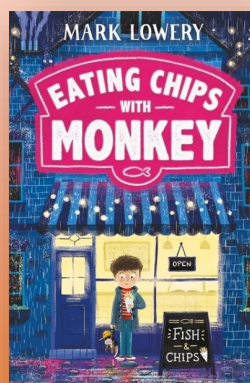
Two very different boys both with dyslexia end up sharing a home when their respective parents get engaged
